Methodology and Sample Information

Between October 8th and October 17th, the Survey Research Center at the University of Arkansas dialed 6,808 randomly selected Arkansas telephone numbers. These attempts yielded 766 completed surveys³. The remainder of the surveys were not completed for a variety of reasons, including the resident's absence, a refusal to participate, a busy or disconnected line, or the resident's ineligibility. Employing guidelines established by the American Association for Public Opinion Research, the poll's cooperation rate was 37%. This figure reflects completed surveys as a percentage of all eligible individuals contacted. The survey's margin of error is +/- 3 percentage points.

To assess the representativeness of the sample drawn for the poll, the Arkansas Poll team opts to publish what most polling organizations do not: a comparison of survey respondents' key demographic characteristics to those of the state as a whole. This information is reported in the table below.
